

SCDOT's Public Notification of Transit Projects Selected to Enhance Rural Transportation

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) is providing notification of the Transportation Commission-approved public comment period for proposed Transit projects to enhance rural transit options. The public has the opportunity to comment on an action to amend the 2017-2022 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to include proposed Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5311 transit funding activities and the list of 21 general public transit providers in 10 regions in rural areas of South Carolina. SCDOT will receive public comment for a 21-day period from October 20, 2020 through November 10, 2020.

The FTA Section 5311 Program's total funding is \$11,216,550 to be allocated for projects related to general public transportation services. Section 5311 funds can be used for capital, administration, planning and operating activities by rural transit operators.

Pending consideration of public comments, the program will be recommended for inclusion in a future revision to the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.
