



## **REVISED NOTICE TO ALL RESEARCHERS**

### **INQUIRY FOR LETTERS OF INTEREST FROM RESEARCHERS WITH DESIGN-BUILD RESEARCH PROCESS EXPERIENCE**

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) is soliciting Letters of Interest (LOI) from all experienced researchers interested in providing research assistance to improve the Department's current design-build delivery method for highway transportation projects. This research should evaluate the effectiveness of the current design-build program, review current project selection processes, identify best practices, identify cost estimating procedures, and develop future effectiveness measuring processes.

All interested candidates should submit an LOI addressing the following:

- Potential project team organization and lead principal investigator – Include pertinent background information for principal investigator(s) and other team members significantly participating in the project.
- Experience with researching or developing design-build programs, contracting mechanisms, and project delivery – Describe academic, professional, and research experiences related to this project. Include a summary of past accomplishments in the same or closely related areas.
- Additional information that could be useful in developing the scope of research
