Hurricane Matthew Status of Operations

6:00 AM

October 18, 2016

Statewide Summary – The removal of downed trees and debris from roads is finishing up and crews are transitioning to repair activities. There are 7 maintenance crews from the upstate and midlands assisting Districts 5 and 6 with road clearing and repair activities. Twelve sign crews from the upstate and midlands have been dispatched to the hardest hit areas of District Five and District Six to begin replacing damaged and missing signs. While most signals are operational, SCDOT and contract signal crews continue to make repairs on remaining damaged signals and flashers. SCDOT bridge inspectors are also working to assess conditions such as scour and support structures for damage. Closed bridges are re-opened to traffic only after bridge inspection teams have performed a thorough inspection.

Damage assessment teams are reviewing infrastructure damage and preparing estimates and quantities necessary to effect repairs using in-house and contractor forces.

The movable bridges on the Intracoastal Waterway in Beaufort, Charleston, and Horry Counties are available to open to marine traffic.

Due to ongoing flooding and areas that have not been assessed, motorists are urged to travel with extreme caution until waters recede and roads are cleared. Conditions are still hazardous with the possibility of trees, debris, and downed power lines blocking roads. Power outages still linger in the hardest hit areas.

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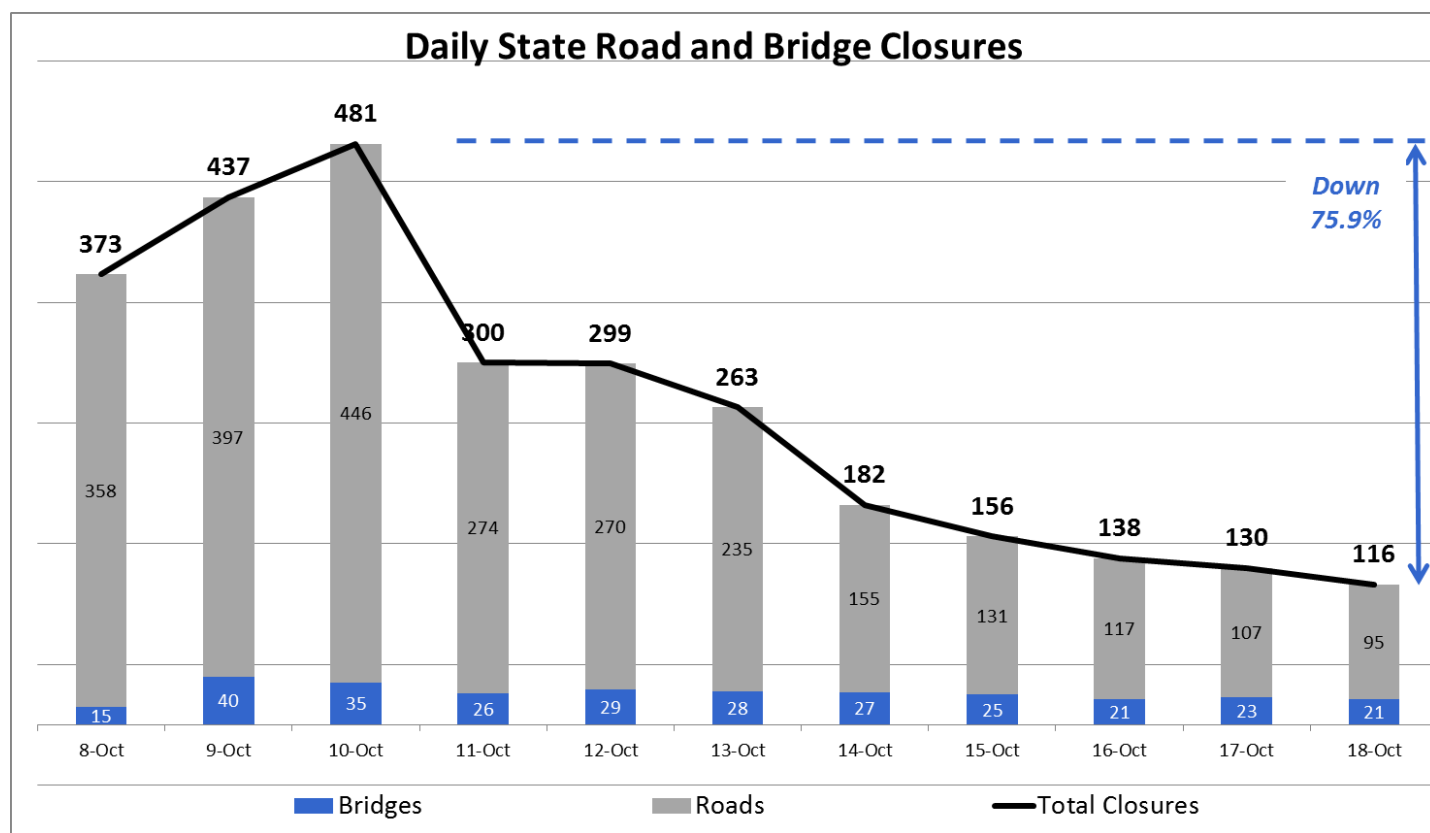
Maintenance Employees Working in Response to Matthew

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The chart below represents the number of road and bridge closures recorded each day.



Engineering District 1 (Kershaw, Lee, Lexington, Richland, and Sumter Counties)

All county offices are back to normal operations with the exception of crews deployed to coastal counties. The field offices are working five 10-hr days as previously arranged before the storm. Most are accomplishing Work Request goals, while still other crews are performing cleanup operations in their respective Counties.

Conditions: Weather conditions are mostly sunny with light winds. Roads are dry.

Staffing: 148 employees are actively working on cleanup items due to storm.

1 two-person sign crew (Richland) deployed to Marion County through Saturday.

1 five-person crew with 1 trackhoe and two 8-yard tandem trucks deployed to Beaufort County through Friday.

1 two-person sweeping crew from Lexington is prepped to deploy to Beaufort on or about Wednesday.

2 two-person vacuum truck crews prepped to deploy to Beaufort on or about Monday 10/24.



Road Closures: All roads are opened in District One that were closed due to Hurricane Matthew.

Engineering District 2 (Abbeville, Anderson, Edgefield, Greenwood, Laurens, McCormick, Newberry, and Saluda Counties)

There are 2 – 2 person sign crews deployed to District 5 working in Horry County. All Counties in District 2 are on On-Call Status at this time.

Conditions: Weather conditions are mostly sunny with light winds. Roads are dry.

Staffing: We have 14 Maint. crews in the district ready to deploy if necessary for hurricane assistance and are preparing 2 of these crews from Anderson to Beaufort on Monday morning to make roadway repairs. We have 4 - 2 man teams on standby to deploy as Preliminary Damage Identification Teams where needed. The District Signal crew is on standby ready to deploy if needed.

Road Closures: None

Engineering District 3 (Greenville, Oconee, Pickens, and Spartanburg Counties)

District 3 is currently at normal operations. Six 2-man sign crews have been deployed to District 5 to assist with the repair of damaged signs and the installation of missing signs. One assistance crew is preparing for deployment to Beaufort County on Monday, October 17th.

District Signal Crews have inventoried available traffic signal equipment and are preparing to deploy for post storm inspections and repairs of traffic signals as necessary.

Conditions: Weather conditions are mostly sunny with light winds.

Staffing: All counties are at normal operations with on-call crews handling issues as normal.

Road Closures: None

Engineering District 4 (Cherokee, Chester, Chesterfield, Fairfield, Lancaster, Union, and York Counties)

All county offices are back to normal operations with the exception of deployment crews. There are currently 8 crews on relief deployment (total personnel 48 employees) to District 5 until Friday, October 21st.

Conditions: Clear and sunny in all counties.

Staffing: All counties and district office under normal operations. No afterhours staffing.

Road Closures: One closure in Chesterfield County due to washout. Repairing with in-house crews.

Materials for repair have been ordered. Estimated completion date of November 11, 2016

Engineering District 5 (Darlington, Dillon, Florence, Georgetown, Horry, Marion, Marlboro, and Williamsburg Counties)

Maintenance Units in District 5 continue the installation of barricades and signage on routes that have been damaged and continue road repairs at damaged locations with in-house crews and assistance crews. Marlboro has completed in-house storm related repairs and is assisting Dillon. Construction



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personnel are continuing to perform assessments of routes for damages. Most District traffic signals are operational and signal crews continue to make repairs on remaining damaged signals and flashers. Sign crews, bridge inspection teams, and maintenance crews from multiple Districts are assisting us with recovery operations. Debris removal operations have started in most District 5 counties.

Conditions:

Maintenance crews continue to open roads when repairs are made, as flooding subsides, and as trees are cleared. A temporary counter-flow traffic pattern is in place on SC-9 in Horry County near the Waccamaw River to accommodate both northbound and southbound traffic as a result of the high river level closing the northbound lanes.

Staffing:

At this time, there are 568 maintenance employees and 40 construction employees engaged in storm response activities.

Road Closures:

There are 12 closures on primary routes in District 5. We were able to open US-76 in Horry and Marion Counties, SC-41 in Williamsburg County, and a portion of SC-905 in Horry County today. The primary routes that have closures are as follows:

Dillon: US-301, US-501, SC-9, SC-57

Horry: US-701, SC-9, SC-905

Marion: US-501, SC-9, SC-41

Engineering District 6 (Beaufort, Berkeley, Charleston, Colleton, Dorchester, and Jasper Counties)

All crews are working diligently to clear roadway and roadway shoulders of debris, repair earth shoulders, and monitor flooded roadways for receding water. A few specific updates are as follows:

1. All available crews performed road maintenance from hurricane issues.
2. Beaufort and Berkeley have completed the road closed list and are repairing infrastructure.
3. One Bridge closures in D6 – Sullivan's Landing Road (S-137) Approach wash out
4. NG completed operations on 174 today and will demobilize tomorrow. Remaining cleanup will be conducted by contact forces.

Conditions:

Conditions are normal.

Staffing:



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197 employees working

22 Assistance personnel from 3 districts arrived in Beaufort County today commencing infrastructure repairs along with county personnel.

Road Closures:

There are currently 10 reported road closures in District 6 due to Hurricane Matthew.

[Engineering District 7 \(Aiken, Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, Calhoun, Clarendon, Hampton, and Orangeburg Counties\)](#)

Debris contractors are starting to arrive in Clarendon, Hampton, Orangeburg and Holly Hill areas. Maintenance Crews in Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, and Calhoun counties are removing hurricane debris from the right of way. Crews from Aiken, Hampton and Orangeburg Maintenance are assisting these counties.

Two of District 7 sign crews are currently working in Williamsburg County assisting with sign repairs.

Conditions: Currently conditions are clear.

Staffing: 281 employees are actively working today. Shifts for Maintenance units are from 7 am to 5pm and on call personnel are monitoring road closures at night to ensure that barricades are in place. District Office staff is back on normal hours.

Road Closures: 4 road closures due to Hurricane Matthew at this time.

Traffic Management Center – The State Traffic Management Center is staffed and operational 24 hours a day. Regional Traffic Management Centers are also operational in Greenville and Rock Hill. The State Highway Emergency Patrol (SHEP) has returned to normal operations.

Customer Service Center – The call center answered 617 calls Monday, Oct. 17. The center will be open 6am-8pm Tuesday

Other Modes of Transportation

Public Transit

- All public transit systems are now running regular service, with Coast RTA (Myrtle Beach) modifying a single daily commuter route due to local conditions in Georgetown County.

Freight and Passenger Rail status:

CSX (Class I)

CSX is continuing to evaluate and repair the A and S lines line that run from Florida up the east coast through Washington, D.C. Large areas of the system are still impacted, particularly south and east of Columbia. The A-Line (I-95 corridor) runs through Florence, Lake City, Kingstree, Charleston and Yemassee, and is expected back in service within two days. This includes the Charleston and South End subdivisions in SC. The S line runs through Cheraw, Camden, Columbia, Denmark and Hardeeville.

The following subdivisions are still undergoing evaluations and repairs and will be out of service for a longer period of time, with no ETA at this time:

Andrews subdivision, between Andrews and Dillon
Columbia subdivision, between Columbia and Fairfax
Creston subdivision, between Creston and Holly Hill
Eastover subdivision, between Columbia and Sumter
Georgetown subdivision, between Andrews and Georgetown
Orangeburg subdivision, between Sumter and Orangeburg
Lane subdivision, between Sumter and Florence

The rest of the CSX network in SC is operating normally.

R.J. Corman (Shortline - Marion and Horry Counties)

Continuing repairs/clearing to resume operations. Addressing 20 washouts, 12 miles of flooded rail, and one locomotive unable to be moved from Nichols.

Estimated return to service is four weeks.

Passenger Rail

Amtrak has cancelled service on routes through SC that use the CSX mainline. These include all Silver Star, Silver Meteor, and Palmetto services in the state, with impacts to stations in Camden, Columbia, Denmark, Dillon, Florence, Kingstree, Charleston, and Yemassee. There is no ETA at this time on resumption of service.

Services using the Norfolk Southern mainline with stations in Spartanburg, Greenville and Clemson are not impacted and are operating.

Public Transit



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All public transit systems are now running regular service, with Coastal RTA (Myrtle Beach) and PDRTA (Florence) modifying some routes due to local conditions.

Airports

Area airports, all are fully operational with the exceptions listed below.

Berkeley County (MKS) - Closed for night operations. Runway circuit boards are damaged from a lightning strike prior to Hurricane Mathew. Notice to Airman (NOTAM) has been issued.

Beaufort County (ARW) - Open for day and night operations. Runway edge lights are operational but taxiway lights and AWOS are out. NOTAM's have been issued.

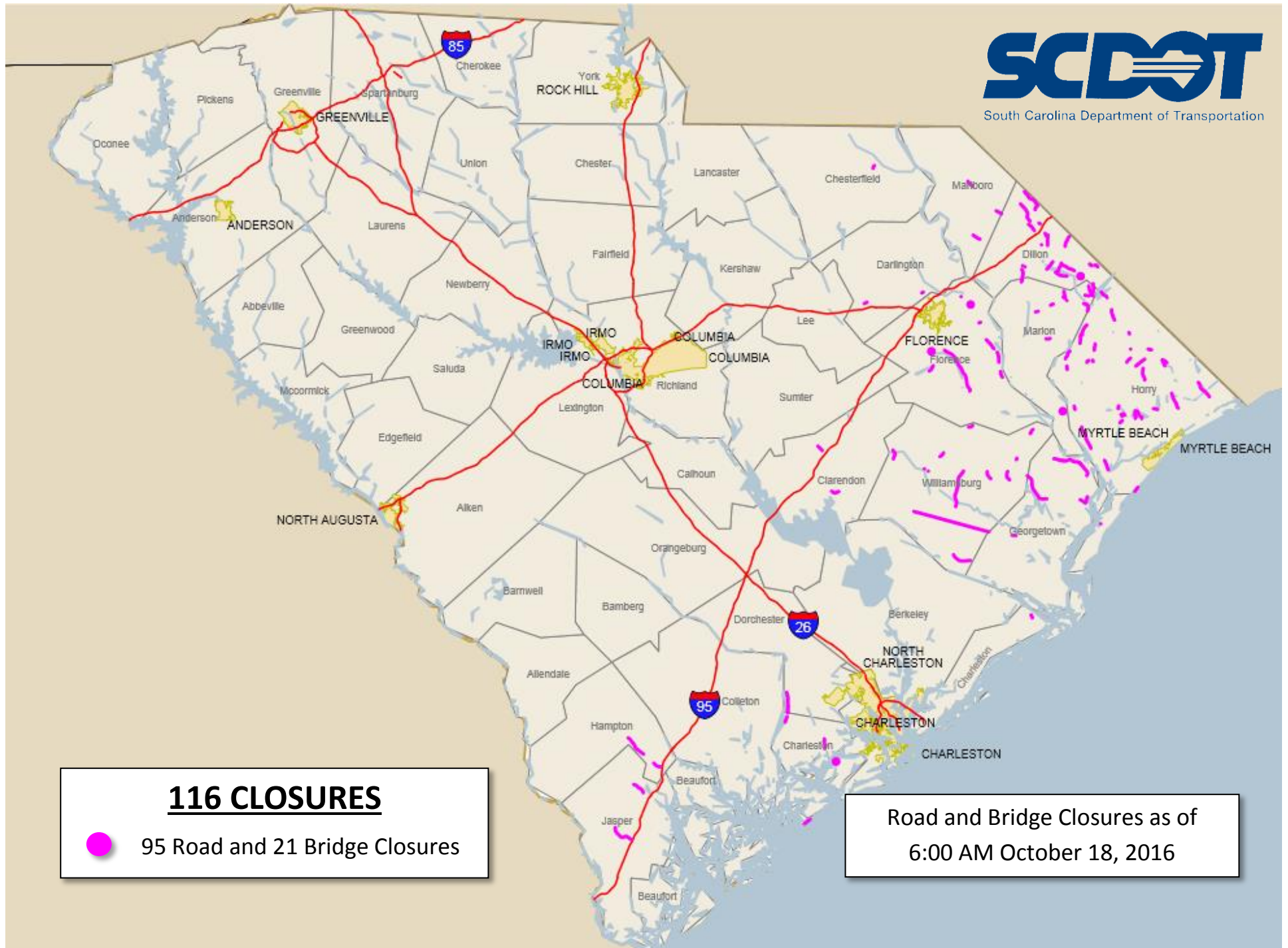
