Hurricane Matthew Status of Operations

Statewide Summary – SCDOT is working to repair infrastructure damaged by Hurricane Matthew. In addition to infrastructure repair, SCDOT is also leading a significant effort to remove storm related debris.

Damage assessment teams have finished assessing the areas with known damage, but in some areas the water needs to recede before making the assessments. SCDOT bridge inspectors are also working to assess support structures for damage, and other conditions such as scour.

Emergency Repair Contracts - 10 Highway/Bridge contractors have been engaged to assist with 36 different “emergency/spot repairs” in 8 counties. All firms are from SC. 1 firm is a DBE.

Included below is summary information regarding closures and debris accomplishments. Detailed reports are also attached.

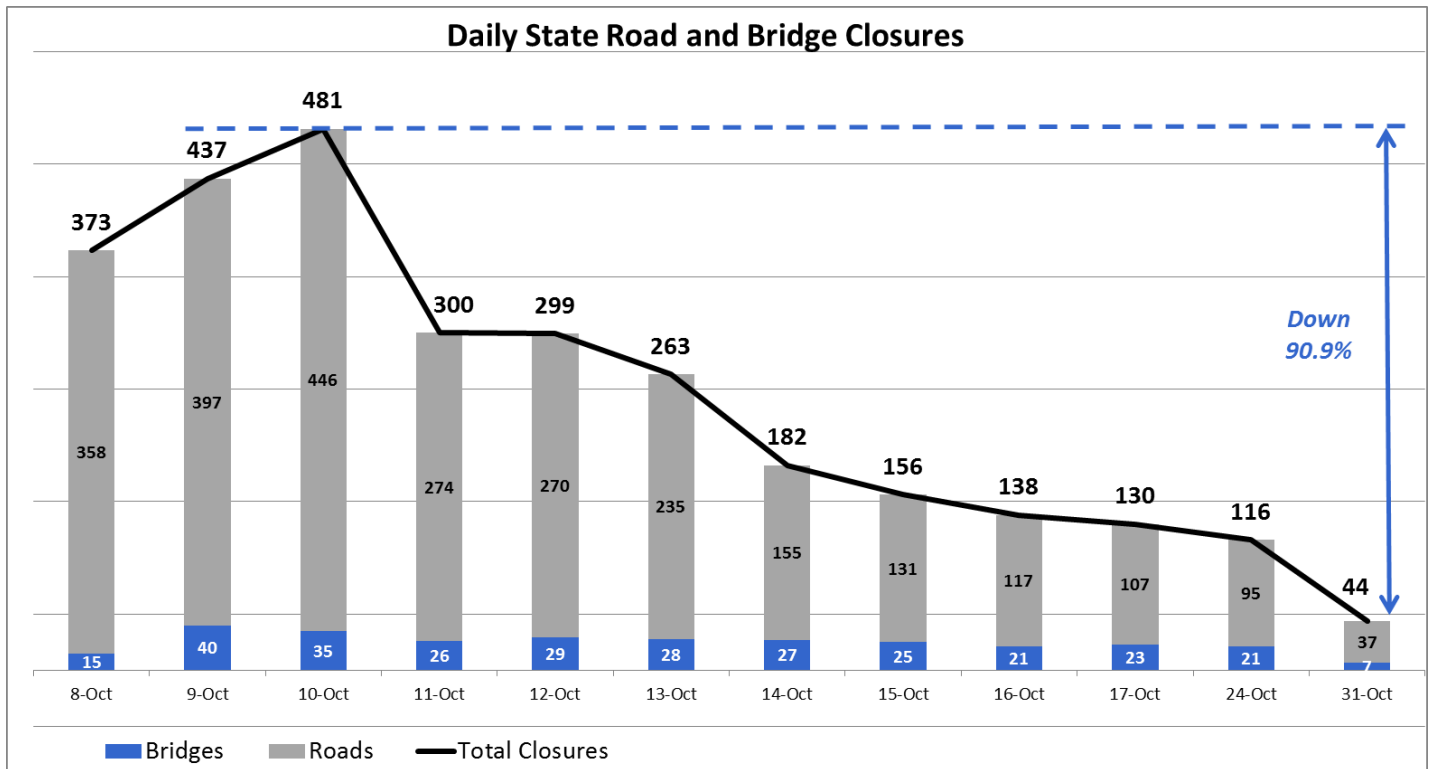
