


Section 4(f) Public Information Meeting

August 30, 2018

WELCOME:

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT), in partnership with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Augusta Regional Transportation Study (ARTS MPO), welcomes you to the Section 4(f) Public Information Meeting for the proposed SC 118 (Hitchcock Parkway) Corridor Improvement project. The purpose of the meeting is to provide an opportunity for the local community, interested citizens, and other project stakeholders to review and comment on potential impacts to a park, Hitchcock Woods.

Hitchcock Woods is a recognized Section 4(f) property in accordance with 23 CFR 774. Use of federal funds subjects the proposed project to the requirements of Section 4(f) of the Department of Transportation Act of 1966 which affords protection to parks. This meeting is being conducted with an informal, open-house format. Your feedback is very important to us, and SCDOT representatives are available to address any questions or concerns that you may have regarding the proposed project. We encourage you to provide written comments on the forms provided, so that we may have a written record of your comments.



Improvements that would impact **Hitchcock Woods**

Improvement D:

- Add right-turn lane on SC 118 westbound onto Dibble Road.
- Add left-turn lanes on Dibble Road onto SC 118.
- Add a new traffic signal.
- This improvement would acquire 0.43 acres of right-of-way from Hitchcock Woods.

BACKGROUND:

The proposed Corridor Improvement project extends approximately 4.8 miles from US 1 (Jefferson Davis Highway) to SC 302 (Silver Bluff Road) in the City of Aiken, and includes potential improvements such as turn lanes, traffic signals, and bicycle/pedestrian accommodations. Hitchcock Woods consists of approximately 2,100 acres and is owned by the Hitchcock Woods Foundation, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. The proposed project would construct new turn lanes along SC 118 and Dibble Road, near the northwestern end of Hitchcock Woods. A right-turn lane from SC 118 westbound onto Dibble Road would be added and a left-turn lane from Dibble Road onto SC 118 would also be constructed. Additionally, a new traffic signal would be installed at the intersection. To construct the turn lanes, approximately 0.43 acres of property would be acquired from Hitchcock Woods. Along SC 118 the current right of way extends approximately 50 feet from the centerline of the road. This would be expanded to approximately 80 feet from the centerline. Along Dibble Road the current right of way extends 40 feet and this would be expanded to approximately 70 feet to support construction of

the turn lanes. Access to Hitchcock Woods and its facilities will be maintained during construction. The purpose of the upgrades is to improve the operational efficiency of the Corridor for both motorized and non-motorized transportation.

SECTION 4(F) PROPERTY

Section 4(f) protects park and recreation sites. The Hitchcock Woods property is open year-round to the public and is part of the SC Department of Natural Resources Heritage Preserve Program. One goal of this public meeting is to receive your feedback regarding this property and inform citizens of how the Section 4(f) designation will affect the Corridor Improvement Project.

Title VI Compliance

SCDOT complies with all nondiscrimination requirements set forth by the Federal regulations issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended.
