

# SC 412 (RAINEY ROAD) PROPOSED CULVERT PROJECT AT BIG GENEROSTEE CREEK TRIBUTARY IN ANDERSON COUNTY



## PROJECT INFORMATION

### What is the Project?

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) is proposing to replace the existing SC 412 (Rainey Road) bridge over a tributary to Big Generostee Creek in Anderson County with a new culvert to be built in the same location. The proposed replacement culvert will be in the same location as the existing bridge.

### What is the Project Purpose?

The purpose is to replace the structurally deficient bridge that carries SC 412 (Rainey Road) over a tributary to Big Generostee Creek, in Anderson County, S.C with a culvert. Structurally deficient is a status used to describe a bridge that has one or more structural defects that require attention. This status does not mean the bridge is not currently safe for vehicle traffic.

### What Will Happen During Construction?

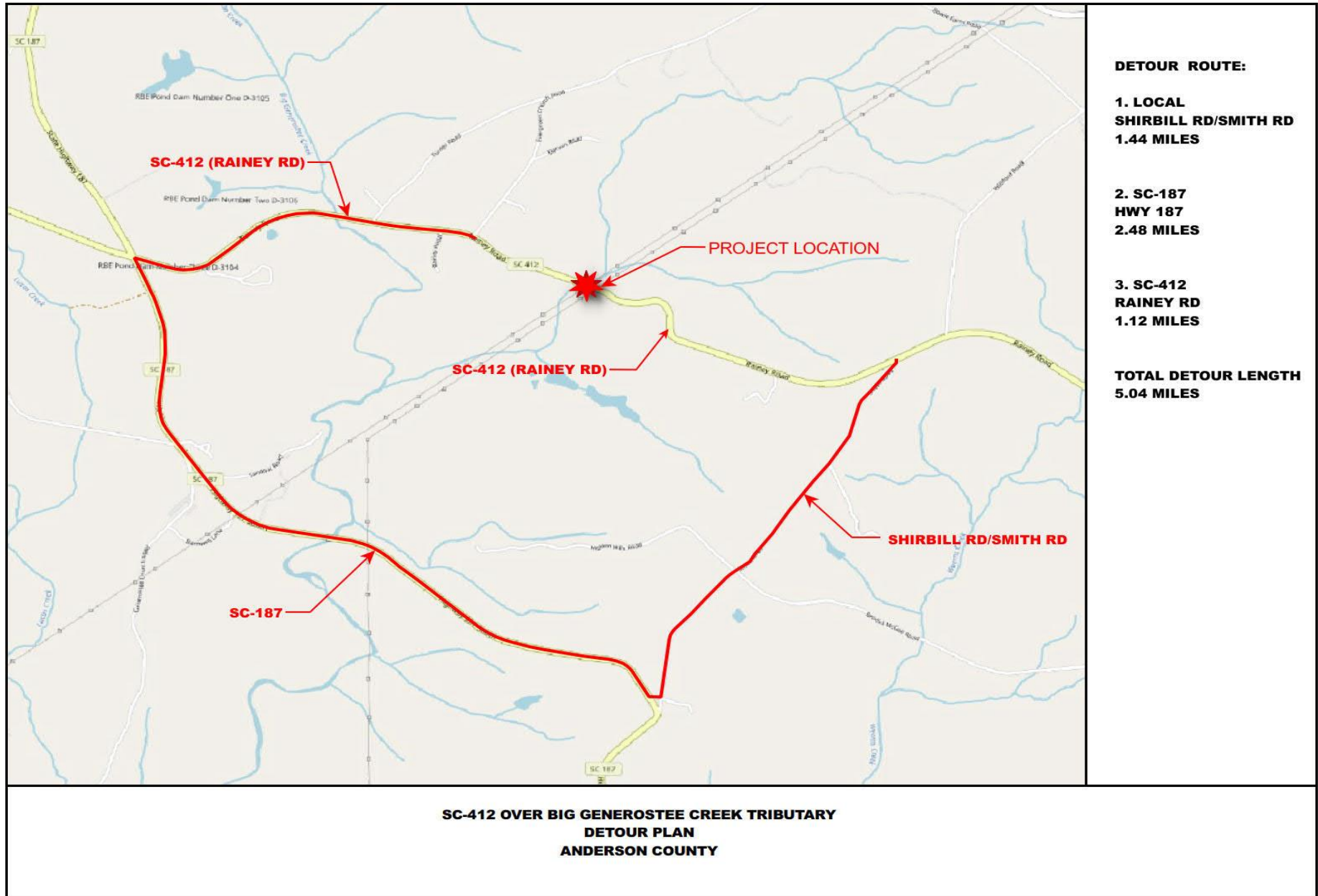
To expedite the time frame of the project and reduce construction impacts SCDOT proposes to close the SC 412 bridge and detour traffic during the project. SCDOT expects to close the road for approximately 12 months while the existing bridge is demolished, and a new culvert is constructed. Information about the proposed detour can be found on the SC 412 detour information page, which is attached to this document.

### How is the Project Funded?

The SC 412 Proposed Culvert Project will utilize both state and federal funds from the Off-System Bridge Replacement Program identified in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).
