► What is the Purpose and Need of the Project?

The purpose of the project is to correct the functional and structural deficiencies associated with the existing SC 421 bridge over Little Horse Creek. The existing structure is a 65-foot long two-span concrete structure and consists of four travel lanes, no median, curb and gutter, and a sidewalk. The original structure was constructed in 1926, and has been widened twice. The existing bridge is documented by the National Bridge Inventory as structurally deficient and functionally obsolete.



► How will the Bridge be Replaced?

The proposed project will consist of replacing the existing bridge with a new bridge north of the current location. The new roadway will consist of four 12-foot travel lanes, a 15-foot paved median, curb and gutter on both sides, and five-foot sidewalks on both sides. Construction will be staged in order to minimize impacts and provide two travel lanes, one in each direction, throughout construction.

► What are the Next Steps for the Project?

As part of the planning process and in accordance the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and SCDOT guidelines, information gathered, along with your input, will be used to refine the proposed alternative.

The following is an estimated project schedule:

Complete Environmental Document – Winter 2018
Right-of-Way Acquisition – 2019/2020
Construction – 2020/2021

SCDOT complies with all requirements set forth by Federal regulations issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation under the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended.
