PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING:

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) welcome you to the public information meeting and appreciate your attendance. The purpose of this public information meeting is to introduce the project, gather public comments, and identify concerns and impacts to the human and natural environment related to the project.

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

SCDOT proposes to improve the intersections of SC 9 and S-43 (Parris Bridge Road) and SC 9 and Sloane Garden Road in Spartanburg County, SC.

The SC 9 and S-43 (Parris Bridge Road) intersection improvement would include access management pavement removal, the addition of exclusive dual left-turn lanes on S-43 (Parris Bridge Road) and lengthening turn lanes on SC 9. The improvements would increase the operational efficiency and capacity of the intersection.

The SC 9 and Sloane Garden Road Extension would realign and extend Sloane Garden Road to a new intersection location with SC 9, approximately 600 feet south of its existing intersection, to align with the new main entrance to the Baxter Village residential development. The new intersection is proposed to be signalized. This connection would provide an alternate route to the 4th Street connection and provide multiple options to travel from I-85/SC 9 intersection to Parris Bridge Road. The existing Sloane Garden Road intersection with SC 9 is proposed to be converted to a cul-de-sac.

The total project is estimated to cost around \$9.9 million for both projects, which includes \$3.8 million for design and right-of-way and \$6.1 million for construction.

ANTICIPATED PROJECT SCHEDULE:

National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) environmental documents will be prepared to assess impacts to the human and natural environment.

- Right-of-way acquisition is anticipated to begin in **Spring 2025**.
- Construction is anticipated to begin in **Spring 2026**.

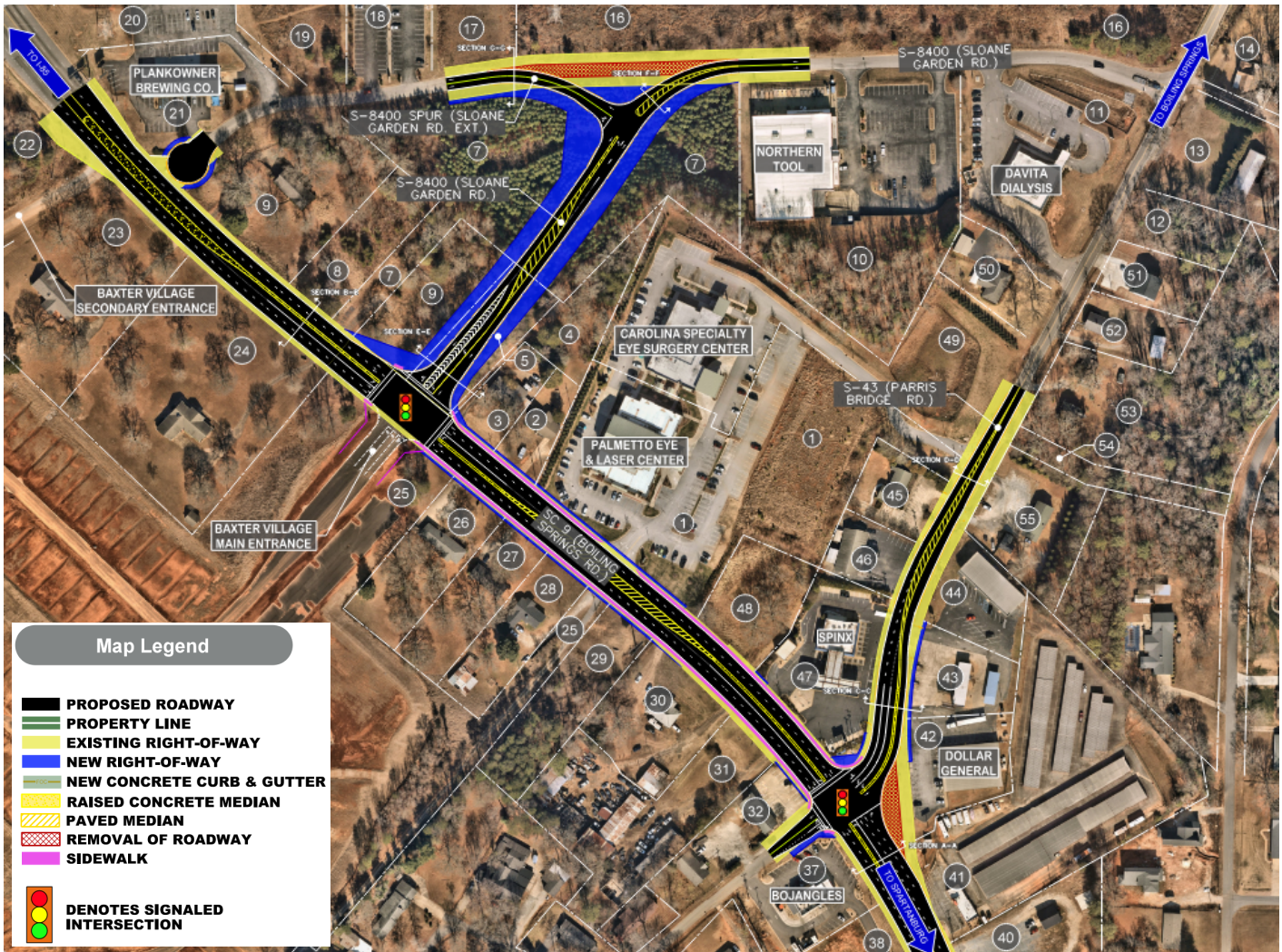
PROJECT PURPOSE:

TITLE VI COMPLIANCE
